Veterans host exhibit of hand-crafted woodwork by foster kids at Falcon Children's Home

[Fayetteville, North Carolina] – The Falcon Children's Home & Family Services is a hidden gem tucked away in the town of Falcon, North Carolina, that provides year-round housing for foster children who require a safe space and positive atmosphere to aid them in their difficult journey of recovering from abuse, neglect, or maltreatment. Providing a creative space for them to design and build hand-crafted works of art with wood, a team of military veterans skilled in woodworking partnered with the Arts Council of Fayetteville|Cumberland County to host the "Falcon Children's Home Woodshop Exhibition" that will be on display May 4 - 20, 2023 at The Arts Center, 301 Hay Street in Downtown Fayetteville. The exhibition is free and open to public viewing.

The exhibition features the woodworking talents and techniques of seven exceptional young ladies from Falcon Children's Home, aged between 14 and 18. Their works include impressive stained-glass art along with a diverse range of woodcrafts such as jewelry boxes, cutting boards, wall art, benches, tables, and more.

John DeGreef, a military veteran and Head Instructor, established the woodshop program in 2015 to instill lifelong skills and build confidence through woodworking. Thanks to the Youth Growth Stock Trust and other kind donations, DeGreef was able to acquire cuttingedge equipment and tools essential for running a fully operational woodshop. Carl Sanders, a woodturning instructor, and Derek Feely, a CNC instructor, later joined DeGreef's experienced woodworking team. They understand the importance of the woodshop as a therapeutic outlet for foster children to manage and release their anger and pain by redirecting their focus toward a creative and rewarding skill.
